INTRODUCTION

The activities range from learning a new language, to conducting scientific research. There are opportunities to gain nationally recognised qualifications or simply to learn a new skill. Read the booklet, pick an option, and make the most of this opportunity.

Sign Up Procedure

Pupils sign-up for activities during the sign-up period, which is open from 10:15am on Thursday 7 September. Once you have chosen your activity please go back into the SOCS site to check it has registered. Activities will start on Friday 8 September.

Sign-up is via the “Activities” tab in the SOCS Co-Curricular software, which can be accessed by www.misocs.com

Not all options are open to all pupils; the options available to you will appear in your sign-up dashboard. Each pupil may only choose one activity from the Friday Afternoon Activities Category.

Places on most activities are limited and, in the majority of cases, are allocated on a first come first served basis. Check that your choice has registered on the system. Most activities last a term but some last the whole year. If you are doing a year-long activity you must continue unless you have been given permission to move. If you are doing term activities check whether you are allowed to repeat it.

Some activities are by invitation only and cannot be chosen online. If you would like to participate in one of these activities, then please read the handbook entry carefully for details of the application procedure. If your application is successful, you will be pre-allocated to the activity and will not be able to select an alternative.

Some activities are extremely popular. If your first choice of activity is full then please select an alternative. In these circumstances, you may select an alternative, then also select your first-choice activity from the Friday Afternoon Waiting List category. If you are successful in securing your place on your first-choice activity then DO NOT select an activity from the waiting list category. Only add your name to the waiting list for an activity if you would prefer to do this activity than the activity you have chosen.

Pupils who do not choose an activity during the sign-up window will be allocated to those with spare capacity. Do not just turn up to an activity that you have not signed up for.

3D Printing

This activity will help you bring your ideas to life. Develop your 3D drawing skills to tweak, design and make artefacts that, through a little refinement, can produce some brilliant pieces to take home. Whether you are new to slicing software or experienced with extrusion, bring some ideas and a willingness to get stuck in with things like machine maintenance and upgrades.

This is an opportunity to experience a range of outdoor activities under expert supervision. Activities will include:

Axe Throwing

Learn to throw axes and tomahawks at wooden roundel targets. This ancient skill is immensely satisfying to experience — once you have learnt the basic techniques you will not want to put the axes down! Training axes are used to learn the basic throwing techniques before the full sized axes are introduced.

Pistol & Rifle Shooting Gallery

A 12 firing point, covered range is used for shooting at an array of reactive targets including 2 'fairground style' knockdown duck galleries against the clock, duelling trees and competition paper targets 5 to 40 metres away using gas powered bolt-action pistols and rifles

fitted with telescopic sights. Individual weapons are provided.

Reverse Steer Snooker

This converted golf buggy provides one of the funniest activities you'll ever experience! The objective is to drive the vehicle through a series of snooker ball coloured gates accumulating the highest break possible along the way. The problem is when the buggy is steered left it will go right and throw a couple of blindfolds in — the result is hilarious!

Archery

A traditional and very enjoyable test of skill. An experienced archery instructor will take the guests through a series of practice sessions and scored competition rounds using light weight and user friendly recurve longbows. Many participants find archery very addictive due to the fast rate of improvement that allows a complete novice to achieve a very respectable score.

Laser Tag

A fast paced 'combat game' where players use laser guns to shoot at opposing team members (the laser guns are perfectly safe!) A simple objective, such as capturing the opponents flag, ensures everyone gets involved - the compact area ensures there is nowhere to hide for too long!

Compact Paintball

A competitive activity involving two teams battling against each other to capture the opponents base. Each player is equipped with a Paintball gun, goggles and set of overalls. During a one hour session approximately 3 games will be played.

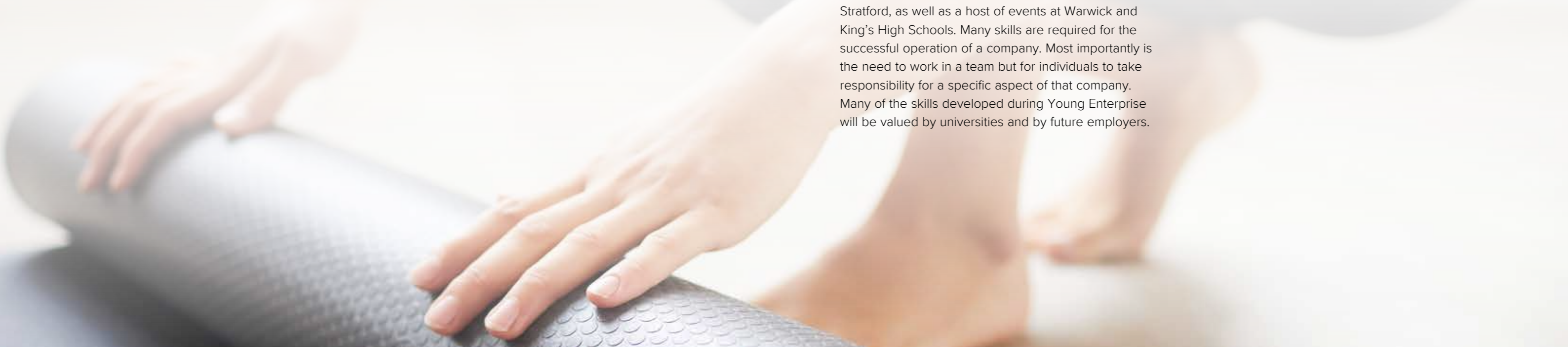
