
The King's High Learning Wheel

We asked pupils and staff these questions, and the King's High Learning Wheel was born. Our central goal as a community of learning is to prepare the changemakers of the future. From here spring

the middle rings, which are central to all of our curricular and co-curricular endeavours. The outer ring, in turn, outlines the longer-term goals of a King's High education.

The Learning Wheel is at the heart of every aspect of the education that we offer at King's. Clearly displayed around the school, we ensure that the Wheel's words and logos are a part of every student's lived day-to-day experience.



The Changemaker Award

How can we celebrate our students’ progress towards being the changemakers of the future? How might we map our pupils’ progress as self-motivated individuals with the skills to change the world for the better?

Our brand new Key Stage 3 Changemaker Award offers a platform where pupils can log the full variety of their achievements, and where teachers can see a clear summary of their hard work.

Whenever a pupil engages in an activity that shows off one of the qualities of the Wheel, they can submit evidence and track their progress. This complements the King’s High Baccalaureate, which pupils complete later in school.

The Changemaker Award reflects our goal to provide not only an outstanding preparation for success in exams, but also a holistic education that will equip pupils for their future lives.
